Eligible candidates must meet the following criteria in order to be considered for the scholarship:

- Under 35 years of age
- Young Professional in the design community (e.g. architecture, construction, engineering, landscape architecture, interior design, architecture and design museum professionals) with less than 10 years of experience in the profession.
- Based in the continental U.S.
- Submit a resume
- Provide a written statement (300 words max) on how the applicant would benefit personally and professionally from having the opportunity to participate in the trip.

Rice Design Alliance is thrilled to announce its next Traveling Program destination for summer 2021 is a trip to Santa Fe, New Mexico curated by Rice Architecture faculty Stephen Fox and Carlos Jiménez.

Santa Fe is a case study in American cultural invention. Capital of the state of New Mexico, the city was spatially reinvented during the first third of the twentieth century by artists, anthropologists, and architects, who abstracted historic building typologies, modes of construction, and landscape formations to formulate a picturesque urbanism that represents itself as rustic, indigenous, and un-designed.

Over five days and four nights, Fox and Jiménez will guide us through the architectural and cultural gems of the high-desert city that distinguish it as a world-class destination. Trip highlights include tours of private homes and visits to some of Santa Fe's most venerable art institutions: SITE Santa Fe, the Lannan Foundation, and the Georgia O'Keeffe Museum, as well as the artist's historic home and studio in nearby Abiquiú. The trip begins and ends in Albuquerque with visits to the University of New Mexico School of Architecture, hosted by Dean Robert González, and the historic Los Poblanos property.

While the trip will be populated with exclusive tours and activities, our itinerary will allow time for you to freely explore Santa Fe and its well-known art galleries, boutiques, and restaurants. See details below on how to join us and other design enthusiasts for this incredible program.
